Let's Set the Stage

LeadingAge

LeadingAge represents more than 5,000 nonprofit aging services providers and other mission-minded organizations that touch millions of lives every day. A member-based association, LeadingAge has 38 state partners and uses applied research, advocacy, education, and community-building to make America a better place to grow old.







Business Case

Existing process:

- 1 Marketo form
- Embedded on multiple pages of LeadingAge's Member Community
- On submission, form redirect to different URL based on referring page
- Member downloads unique resource



Business Case

Alternate example:

- Crafting website has three sections knitting, sewing, and embroidery
- Each section has multiple projects
- Every project has a PDF pattern download
- Users fill out one form to download desired pattern
- On completion, they are taken to a page with the PDF pattern they want
- On the back end, both total form completions and downloads of individual patterns can be measured



Added a hidden field to the form

(hidden)

Link to use (a)

- Mapped to Custom Field on Prospect Record called Link_To_Use
- Script populates hidden field with URL of embedded form page



Prospect record - custom field data

Record and reuse

Link to use seltoolmed

- Engagement path (send survey about resource, use form completion and custom field as criteria)
- Build lists for each area of interest
- Automation rule to add tag based on field data
- Send notifications to Users when field is populated
- Adjust score or grade based on data in field



Other Javascript applications

"Javascript is the duct tape of the internet"

- Change Thank You message to display alternate versions depending on grade, score, referring URL, other known data
- Change redirect URL based on varying field input
- Add different UTM codes to redirect URLs based on form selections
- Change text on button depending on asset type (Download for a PDF, View now for a webinar)

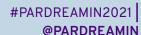
- Single form, multiple completion actions (The Spot for Pardot)
- Add placeholder text within Pardot forms (Jenna Molby)
